Do you know where we are on the map?




We are here!

Have you seen this before?


This is the Union Flag.

Queen Elizabeth II


Elizabeth II lives in London and is the Queen of the UK.

Today we are going to look at the 7 continents of the world




Here you have the 7 continents of the world


Today we are going to look at somewhere out of the UK

Do you know where Kenya is on our map?




Let's take a closer look... Can you see Kenya?





There is it ...



Kenya is located in East Africa. It is known as the Republic of Kenya.

Kenya's population is around 44 million! Kenya is one small country compared to the vast size of the continent, Africa.



This is Kenya's national flag:




Is it similar or different to ours?


Nairobi is the capital city and Mombasa is the largest city in Kenya.




The population in Kenya is around 44,010,056

What's the weather like in Kenya?



Kenya lies on the **equator**. Have you heard of the **equator** before?

An **equator** is an imaginary line around the middle of a planet. It is halfway between the North Pole and the South Pole, at 0 degrees latitude. An **equator** divides the planet into a Northern Hemisphere and a Southern Hemisphere.

Kenya has a tropical climate. This means that unlike in the UK where we have 4 seasons, a tropical climate means that they only see 2 seasons which are a wet season and a dry season.

I would like you to watch this video of a small town in Kenya. Watch carefully and have a think about what you can see. Does it look similar or different to Bradford. Can you see anything we have over here?

The weather in Kimilili

It has a tropical climate. At the coast it is very humid, especially in January and February. The long rainy season lasts from March to early June, the short rainy season is from October to late November. It is **warm** throughout the year, with temperatures between 27 °C and 33 °C.



Today, using all the knowledge we have about the UK and Kenya we are going to compare our two towns that we looked at. Bradford and Kimilili.



We are going to look at the similarities that the two towns share and the differences.
